ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Academic: You will normally require a UK Master's degree or international equivalent in a discipline related to your proposed research area.

English: Normally IELTS 6.5 overall is required, but some research areas might require a higher level of English. Please contact the relevant research centre or view our English requirements webpage mmu.ac.uk/englishrequirements

ENGLISH LANGUAGE SUPPORT

If you have received a conditional offer and need to improve your English before you start your postgraduate research programme, Manchester Met can help you. Our British Council accredited Language Centre offers pre-sessional English and long-term preparation courses. Courses run from April and throughout the summer for September degree entries and are designed to help you achieve the level of English language proficiency you need to start your programme, without needing to take another IELTS.

TUITION FEES 2020/21
