STUDENT VISA

To gain permission to enter the UK as a student from outside the European Economic Area, it is likely you will need to apply for a Tier 4 student visa. You will need to hold an unconditional offer from King's to apply for a visa. Once you receive your unconditional offer, we will issue you with a Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS) number, which you will need in order to apply for your Tier 4 student visa.

To apply for a visa you are required to show you have sufficient funds to cover your tuition fees and maintenance (for yourself and any dependents in the UK). EEA and Swiss students do not currently require a visa to enter and study in the UK. This is subject to change if the UK leave the EU on 31 January 2020. More information can be found online.
