



studying at Cardiff University

Choosing to study at Cardiff
University will allow you to join a
global academic community of
staff and students. Our mission
is to undertake world-leading
research with impact and pass
this knowledge onto our students
to make a social, cultural and
economic difference.

How will studying at Cardiff be different?

Studying at Cardiff University may be different from the style of teaching in your country. Cardiff University is an innovator in 'problem-based' learning. This means your lecturers will set you a 'problem' and you will have to work out the answer. This is a much more effective method of learning than just from a book.

You will be:

- expected to use the libraries and internet to research topics
- asked to contribute your opinion, collate information and present evidence
- encouraged to share your own ideas
- educated through a variety of teaching and assessment methods.

Teaching methods

You will be taught in formal lectures, in small groups (called 'seminars') and one-to-one with the tutors. Depending on your subject you may use laboratories, meet members of the public, operate specialist equipment and go on field trips. You will also have access to Cardiff's virtual learning environment to enhance and support your learning. It allows you to download lecture materials, communicate with your tutors and submit assignments online.

Assessment methods

Assessment methods are different for each course. Most courses include some form of written examination and essays, but you may also be assessed on presentations, class tests, laboratory results and group work.

Personal Tutors

You will be allocated a Personal Tutor at the beginning of your programme. Your Personal Tutor will be able to provide you with advice, whilst maintaining an overview of your learning and educational experiences.

If you are experiencing difficulties, your Personal Tutor will be there to listen and provide professional guidance and support.

Independently verified and reviewed

You can be confident of the quality and standard of a Cardiff degree. The University is recognised by more than 40 professional bodies which ensure that the University maintains its high standards of teaching. In 2017 the Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF) panel awarded Cardiff University a silver award. This means that the University consistently delivers high quality teaching, learning and outcomes for its students, and it consistently exceeds rigorous national quality requirements for UK higher education.

Research Projects

Our researchers collaborate with partners worldwide to tackle critical global issues, from poverty reduction and health promotion in Africa to biodiversity and conservation in Borneo.



Phoenix Project – Through our partnership with the University of Namibia, we have launched the Phoenix Project, focusing on poverty reduction, health promotion and supporting a sustainable environment. Over the past 4 years, we have educated doctors and nurses, created a vibrant software sector, enshrined a value for culture and language among young people, and enabled the police and ambulance service to save lives. The next 5 years will encourage and develop leadership skills of nurses, produce library and information services, support sustainable access to water and more.




enhance your résumé

Safe and supportive

One of the advantages of University residences is the support you are offered. Each residence has a network of residences staff, Residence Life Assistants and security staff that provide 24 hour assistance.

Guaranteed

Accommodation is guaranteed for all full degree international students for the duration of your studies.

You will have your own study bedroom. Cardiff University does not have shared rooms or dormitories.

How much does it cost?

The cost of residences depends on several factors which include the residence you choose, length of stay, meal options and whether you want private bathroom facilities. University residences are very good value as the cost includes water, electricity, security, furniture and internet access. As everything is included in one price, it helps you budget more easily. To help with budgeting there is more detail about living expenses on page 46.

For the 2019/20 year self-catered residences range from £111-£156 a week. Part/fully catered residences range from £126-£152 a week. Rooms with private bathrooms are generally more expensive than rooms with shared bathrooms.

University residences

The University has 17 residences, each with different facilities, in different locations and at different costs.

Your choices include:

- single or mixed-gender accommodation
- private or shared bathrooms. About 70% of University residences have private bathrooms (called 'ensuite')
- self-catered, part-catered, fully-catered*
- a variety of social and sporting facilities
- quiet living options.

*Fully-catered option is only offered at Aberdare Hall, a female-only residence.



Close to campus

Cardiff University residences are very well located, with most residences being less than 2km to either the Cathays Park campus or Heath Park campus. The majority of students are able to easily walk or cycle to their lectures every day. The table below gives the approximate walking times from three residences to four popular locations in Cardiff.

Look at the map on page 47 to see where residences are located. You will also find that like the University, residences are within easy reach of shops, the city centre and parks.

Your guarantee of accommodation

You are guaranteed a single-occupancy place in University residences for the full duration of your studies. This is providing you apply through the normal admission and allocation process, and re-apply for residences each year through the overseas returners process.

How do I reserve residences?

After you apply, and if you accept an offer to study, you will be sent full information on how to apply for University residences.

Coming to Cardiff with your family

The University has a limited number of flats, houses and studios available for first-year international students with family members. These residences are very much in demand and you may have to seek private accommodation. If you do choose private accommodation ensure you start looking as soon as possible and ask for assistance from the University.


What do University residences provide?

The diagram opposite shows a layout of a typical ensuite flat in University residences. Please note that this is an example and the number and size of rooms in each flat varies.

In this example there are 6 study bedrooms, each with their own bathroom. The 6 occupants share a kitchen. Every student has their own bedroom. Each room has a bed, desk, chair, wardrobe and storage. You won't need to buy additional furniture. If you choose 'ensuite' you will have your own bathroom with shower.

All bedrooms are connected to the University high-speed Wi-Fi network. In your flat you will have access to a shared kitchen/ dining room. This area includes a cooker, refrigerator, sink, table and chairs.

The Lounge

Built with international students in mind, this modern venue is open to all, free of charge. It boasts state of the art multimedia stations with Skype access, versatile work spaces, modern meeting rooms and touch screen tables.

International societies

The best way to make friends is to join a student society. These clubs are very important to student life and are run by other students. There are more than 200 societies, many of which represent areas of the world including: Africa, Canada, China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Latin America, Malaysia, Oman, Pakistan, Nigeria and more.

For two weeks every year the international societies celebrate 'Go Global' – a festival that showcases the University's diversity involving dance, music and food.

Sport & keeping fit

The University takes sport very seriously and encourages participation at all levels. The Athletic Union runs more than 60 sports clubs and arranges fixtures against other universities.

World class facilities are located across four sites and include a Sports Training Village with a multi-purpose indoor sports hall and physiotherapy clinic, a Fitness and Conditioning Centre, dance studio and 33 acres of first-class grass pitches including a full-size floodlit 3G FIFA/IRB approved match pitch.

You might be wondering what life is like for the 31,500 students at Cardiff University. Outside of academia you will find a vast range of opportunities to try new things, meet new people and enjoy the exciting atmosphere on campus.



Supporting you

From academic questions to personal issues, Cardiff University offers students support in many ways:

- every student at the University is allocated a personal tutor who can assist with any academic or personal problems
- the Student Support Centre has specialist international advisers who can help you with visas, housing, finances and anything else that you would like to talk about
- if you want to talk to someone outside the University, the Students' Union also has an advice centre
- Cardiff University is one of only a few UK universities to provide postgraduate students with dedicated social, training and academic facilities at the University's Postgraduate Study Zone
- if you are not sure where to turn or who to talk to, you can always visit the International Office for advice.

Orientation

There's no need to worry about settling in, making friends or life in the UK. Our aim is to make your transition to Cardiff as smooth as possible with an 'induction and orientation programme' in September and January.

The September induction programme includes:





Who can apply?

- you have studied for two years at another university which is recognised by Cardiff University
- you have achieved certain grades in the preceding years.
 Commonly this is a GPA of 3.0 or equivalent (on a 4.0 scale), although some Schools may require a higher average
- your home university will permit you to Study Abroad and recognise grades achieved at Cardiff University as contributing to your degree
- you are from outside the European Union.

Note: for some modules (classes/courses/units) you may be required to show you have certain pre-requisites/background knowledge.

The English Language Programmes teaching centre offers a variety of courses ranging from eight weeks to nine months which cater for most language levels and abilities. Students come from all over the world to improve their English before starting university study.

English for University Study

The English for University Study Programme is a full-time English language and study skills course in academic English. It will provide you with the academic study skills that you need to study effectively in a UK environment, covering language, study and professional skills and British academic culture.

The English for University Study Programme is a good choice if you plan to continue your higher education studies at foundation, undergraduate or postgraduate level. You will need to take a test to demonstrate your English is of an appropriate level.

The programme provides you with the skills and language needed for a smooth transition into academic study. The aim is to develop confident and successful students who are equipped for university study in the UK.

Our Academic Schools will accept the English for University Study Exit Test scores instead of a valid IELTS. Exit tests can be taken at the end of each term.

The English for University Study Programme has three entry points: in September, January and April/May.

In-sessional English Language Support


Many international students feel they need further help with English language after starting their course. If you would like to have some additional English language support, the in-sessional team can help you.

When is the application deadline?

Undergraduate – The official UCAS deadline for most courses is 30 June. If you want to apply after this date, please contact the International Office: *international@cardiff.ac.uk*. If you are applying for Medicine or Dentistry, the application deadline is 15 October prior to entry in September the following year

Postgraduate – Most postgraduate courses do not have a deadline, however the University encourages you to apply as early as possible to avoid disappointment. You must ensure you have enough time to complete the application process and, where applicable, get a visa. Some courses can become full quite quickly. It is recommended that you apply 9-12 months in advance of the course starting

How to write your personal statement

Your personal statement is an opportunity to tell the University about yourself, say why you're interested in the course and provide details of any relevant experience you have. Here are some useful tips for writing a good personal statement:

Be enthusiastic

Admissions tutors are looking for students who are passionate about the area they are studying. Tell us why you are interested in the course, what research you have done into the subject and what you plan to do after you graduate.

Include any work experience

Telling us about any relevant work or volunteering experience will demonstrate your commitment. This is very important for any healthcare related courses, which require you to demonstrate an understanding of the demands of working in these professions.

Show you can be part of a team

Admissions tutors are looking for students that will integrate and work well with other students. If you have been a member of a team or held a position of responsibility, you should show how these experiences will help in your studies.

Include your interests

The University looks for students who will contribute to the wider student community. You should provide information on your social and cultural hobbies, such as community volunteering, playing a musical instrument and sport.

Demonstrate ability in English

Detail how you have used English since your last English exam (For example: at work or during your studies) and check your spelling and grammar. It is a good idea to ask somebody to proof-read your personal statement.



What if I don't have all my qualifications/transcripts?

You do not need all your qualifications before you apply. You can take exams and submit your results after your initial application.

My studies have been completed in English - do I still need an English qualification?

If you have previously studied in the medium of English this may be sufficient for the English requirement. This is at the discretion of the School. If you believe this could apply to you please state your reason in your application. You may still be required to provide a recognised qualification.

How long will it take to have a decision made on my application?

The University endeavours to make a decision on applications within six weeks, however during busy times it may take longer. If you have not had a response after six weeks please contact the International Office. Because PhD applications are more complicated, they can take longer to assess.

English language requirements

In addition to academic qualifications, the University also requires an English language qualification from all applicants. We accept IELTS, TOEFL, and iGCSE/GCSE amongst many other qualifications including Indian Year 12 and WAEC. Different courses will require you to achieve different scores, however, most courses usually require a score of 6.5 in IELTS (with at least 5.5 in each sub-score) or equivalent qualification. Some courses require a higher overall score, especially those that are language-based and require more complex English usage. You should check the website, contact the School or ask the International Office if you are unsure of the requirement. If you do not have the required English language level you may want to consider an English language course at Cardiff University. More information is on page 42.

Fixed Tuition Fees

To help plan your budget for your time in Cardiff, the University has fixed tuition fees for the duration of the course. This means your tuition fee will not rise.

Tuition fees are different for each course and there may be some exceptions. You should check the website or contact the International Office for further advice.

You can also pay your tuition fees in three installments each year, to help manage your finances.

Funding and Scholarships

In recognition of the outstanding talent of many international students, Cardiff University offers a highly prestigious International Scholarship Fund, designed to attract and reward the best students. In addition to its own scholarship programmes, Cardiff University is also pleased to offer a number of scholarships in association with partnership organisations. Living Expenses

For the 2019/20 session, the University estimated that:

- an undergraduate student (September – June) needed £9,980 a year
- a postgraduate student (September - September) needed £12,274 a year.

These estimates include university accommodation, bills, food, books, clothes, travel, telephone and social expenses.

If you are intending to bring family members, such as a spouse or child, you will need to have at least an extra £680 a month for each family member.

Working Part-Time

Cardiff University is in the middle of one of Europe's fastest growing cities and there are many opportunities for part-time employment both on campus, and in the city. The University's "Jobshop" offers a free service to help you find part-time employment. Usual jobs for students include helping out in shops and at events, call centre work and basic office assistance.

Most international students can work up to 20 hours during term time and full-time during the holidays. The University does not recommend you work the full 20 hours during the term because studying in the UK is intensive and you will need to make sure you have enough time to complete all your coursework and reading.

Cardiff has many advantages which make it a cheaper place to study than other university cities. These include:


- Cardiff is a compact city and the University is in the middle – therefore you won't have far to travel between the University, city centre shops and your accommodation.
- Cardiff is also very flat making it easy to walk or cycle around. You won't need to spend money on buses or taxis.
- Cardiff has various bicycle and car sharing schemes that students can make use of. This will make it even easier for you to get around without large extra costs.
