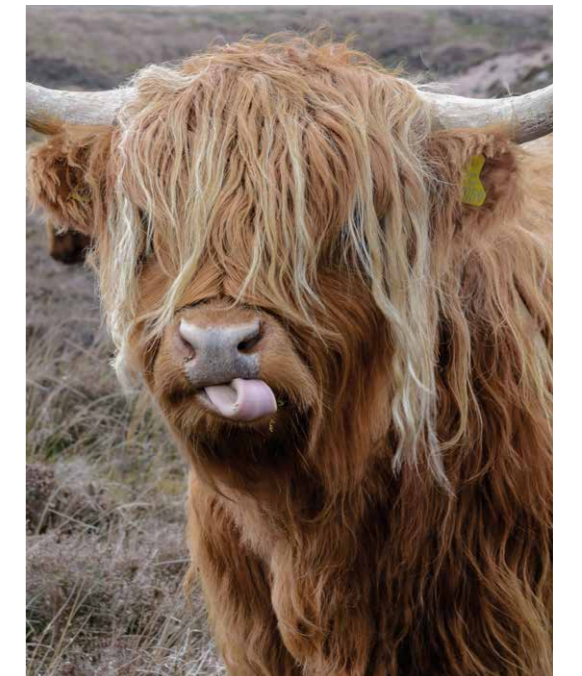

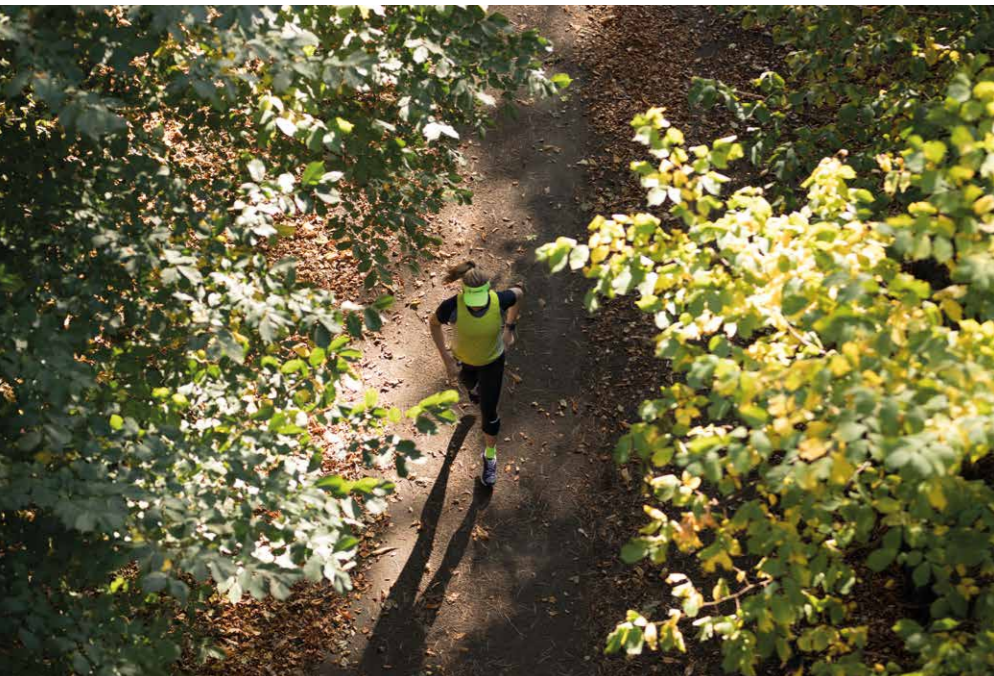




Introducing Dundee

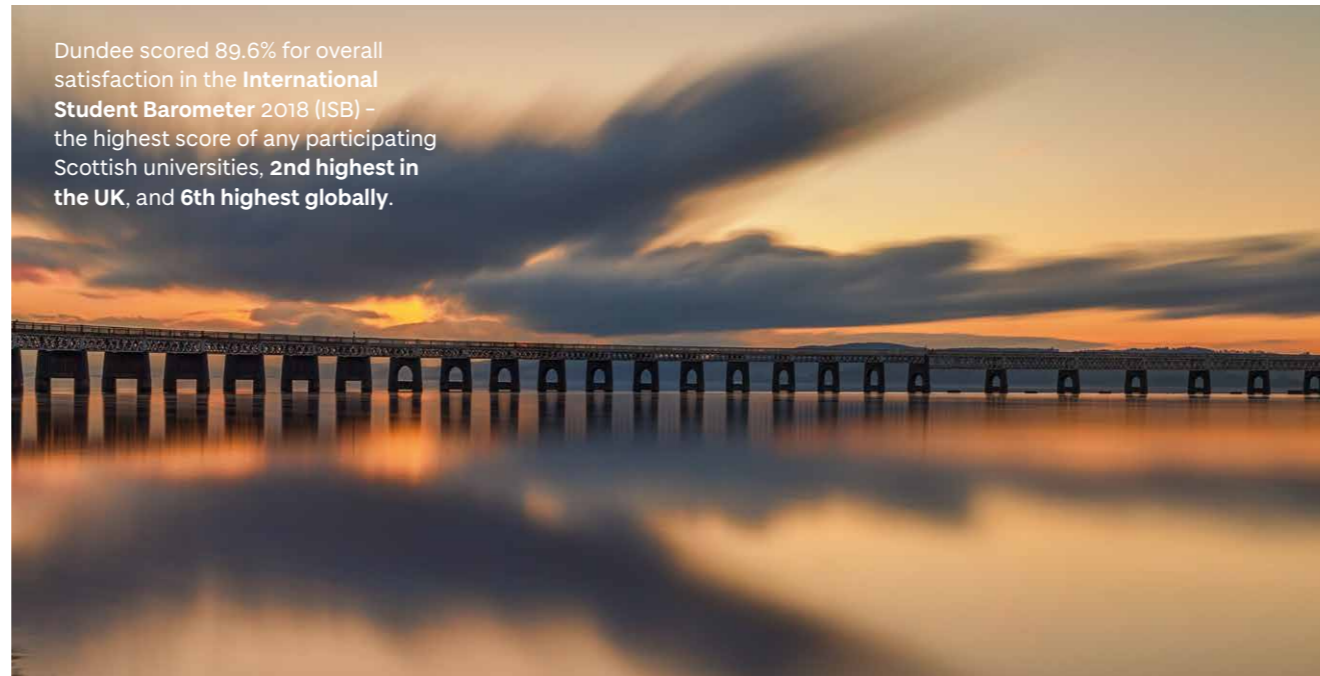

The University of Dundee is ranked 16th in the world for Good Health and Wellbeing in the Times Higher Education University Impact Rankings 2019 - with the city offering plenty of greenspace and waterfront views. Our campus is a wonderful blend of the old and the new, with striking architecture, hidden gardens and state of the art facilities.

Your Scottish undergraduate degree

Alongside our **bachelor's degrees**, the ancient universities of Scotland - St. Andrews, Glasgow, Aberdeen, Edinburgh, and Dundee - award students a unique degree in humanities and social sciences: the **Master of Arts (MA) degree**.

This historic degree structure gives you a great amount of flexibility and choice in your studies. You can choose a mix of subjects in your first two years, before deciding which one(s) you would like to specialise in for your final two years. You can graduate with either single honours - for example MA (Hons) Politics - or joint honours - for example MA (Hons) Politics and Economics.

Suitably qualified students can enter at level 2 (2nd year) if they wish.

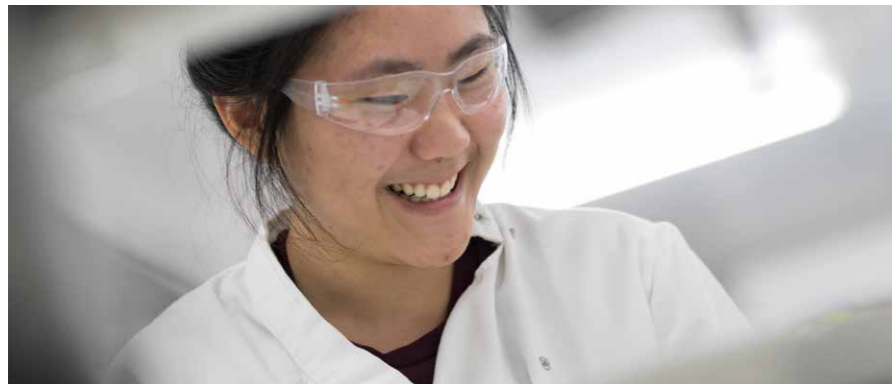

World leading research

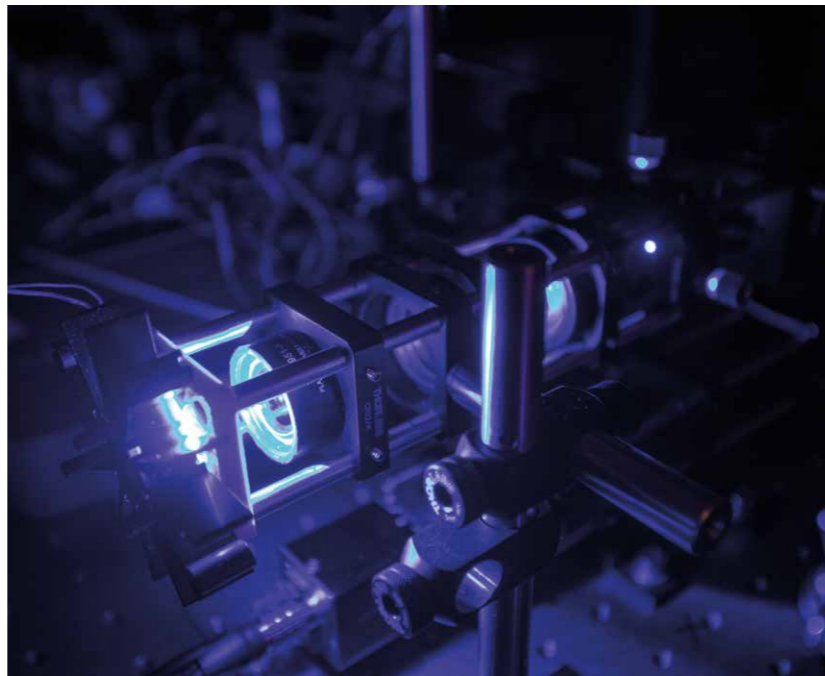
Research at Dundee has been ranked among the very best in the UK. In fact, in the latest Research Excellence Framework (2014), we were the highest rated university for Biological Sciences, and 76% of our research was rated as being **'world-leading'** or **'internationally renowned'**.

Over 30% of our funding comes from research, and this translates into **world-changing solutions** for health, the environment and the economy.



"Researchers at Dundee have made, and continue to make, a profound international impact. Many of the satellites and spacecraft launched into orbit have circuitry designed and built here, while our translational biomedical research underpins global efforts to tackle cancer, diabetes, and tropical diseases. 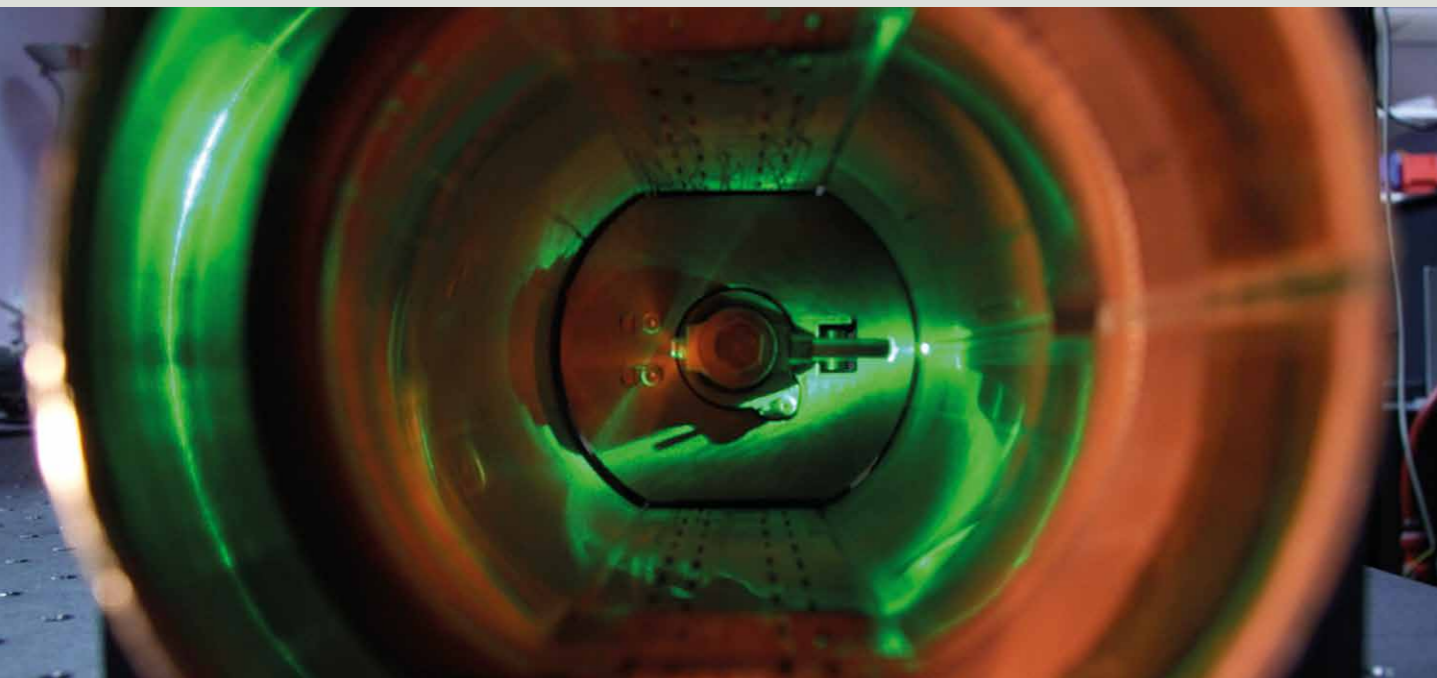


Recent areas of world-leading research include research into Parkinson's by Professor Alessi – whose work on protein kinases has won him a host of prestigious scientific awards including the Colworth Medal and the EMBO Gold medal, as well as making him **one of the world's most cited biochemists**.



Ambition, innovation, transformation

Researchers at Dundee are helping to take the Large Hadron Collider (LHC) at CERN – the world's largest science experiment – to a new level with pioneering laser technology



Professor Amin Abdolvand and colleagues at the University of Dundee have developed new laser technology which solves one of the fundamental problems the LHC faces:

“Large particle accelerators such as the Large Hadron Collider suffer from a fundamental limitation known as the ‘electron cloud’. This is a cloud of negative particles which can form in the vacuum of the LHC and affect the proton beam, basically acting as interference. They need to get those electrons out of the way at key points in the collider. This is very challenging but with the new techniques we have developed we have now tested and proved a method that can be used.”

Professor Abdolvand, Chair of Functional Materials & Photonics at the University and Associate Dean Research in our School of Science and Engineering.

This technique is known as LESS, or Laser Engineered Surface Structures. By using lasers, Professor Abdolvand and the team are able to reformulate the surface of

metals. In the context of the LHC, this means using the lasers to design the surface of the metal tube to ensure it can ‘capture’ electrons and take them out of the way of the proton beam.

In addition to our laser work, the University of Dundee is a partner of the CMS Collaboration at CERN, the European Organisation for Nuclear Research.

Dundee is the first Scottish university to join the CMS Collaboration, and is one of only five UK institutions, joining Imperial College London, University of Bristol, Brunel University London, and the Science and Technology Facilities Council.

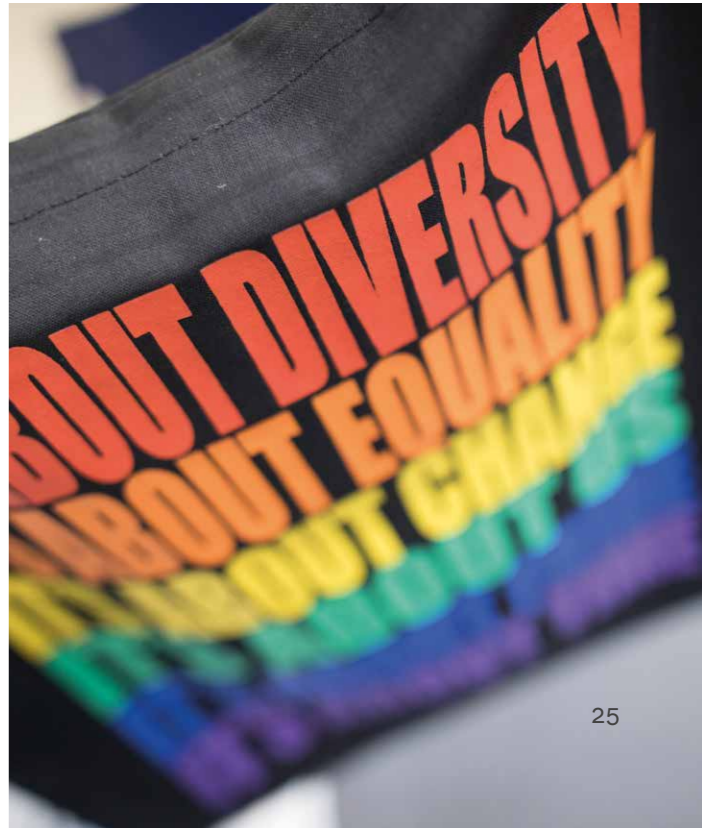

An affordable place to live

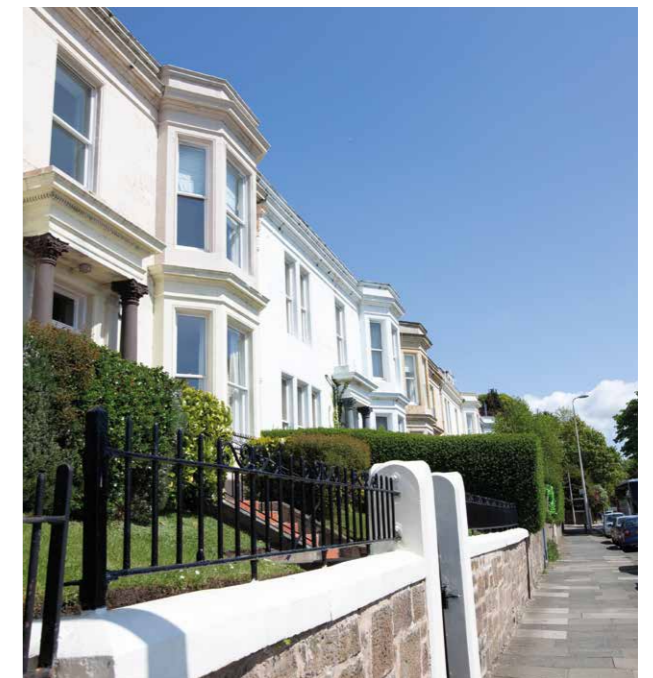
Dundee is a very **cost-effective** place to study. A Citylets Rental Report in 2019 found that Dundee is by far the cheapest out of Scotland's major cities to rent privately, with the average cost of rent in Dundee being **44% less** than Edinburgh, and **21% less** than the Scottish national average.

Our city campus is a self-contained student community where everything is close together. Our students don't need to worry about cars or taxis when the accommodation, library, teaching areas, students' union and gym are all nearby.



Comfortable and affordable accommodation

Our 250 self-contained flats offer single occupancy bedrooms, in single sex flats if requested, with private high-spec shower rooms. Each flat has a well-equipped kitchen, limited personal contents insurance included, and there's a laundry on site. The cost of accommodation covers utility bills, and we provide dedicated resident support. Dundee also has one of the largest superfast wifi installations outside of the US which allows hundreds of students to stream films, TV, and games at the same time, and connect up to 15 devices to the network. uod.ac.uk/ddds-accomm





Top-class study, teaching and learning spaces

Dundee's main library gives you long opening hours (open until 2:30am in semester time and 24 hours a day during exams) and a café to keep you going through those study sessions. There are plenty of dynamic spaces for group, quiet, or silent study, as well as private rooms.

Part-time work opportunities

If you are an undergraduate on a Tier 4 student visa, you can work a maximum of 20 hours per week during semester-time and full-time during the holidays.

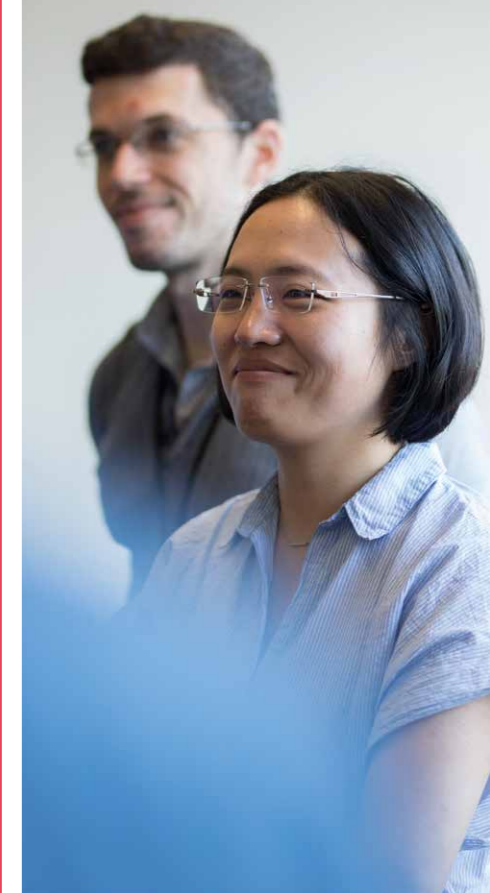

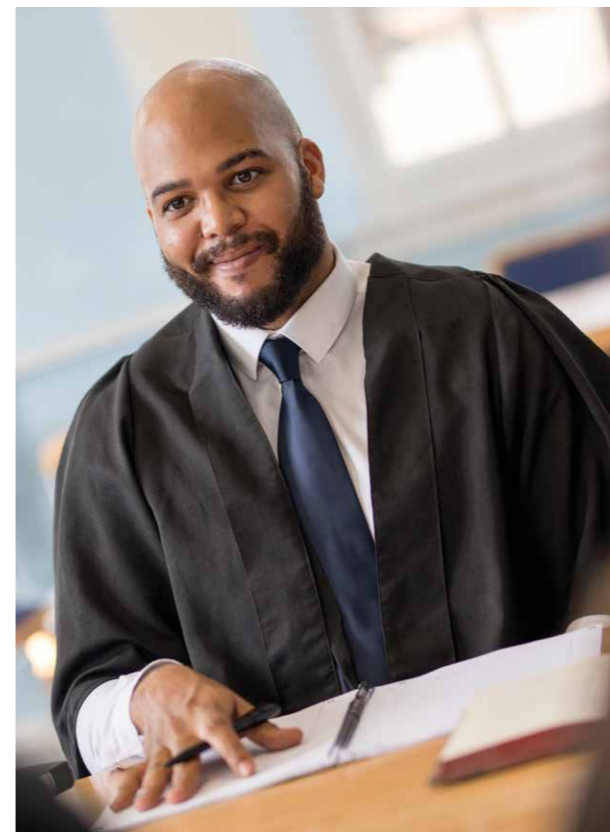


International College Dundee

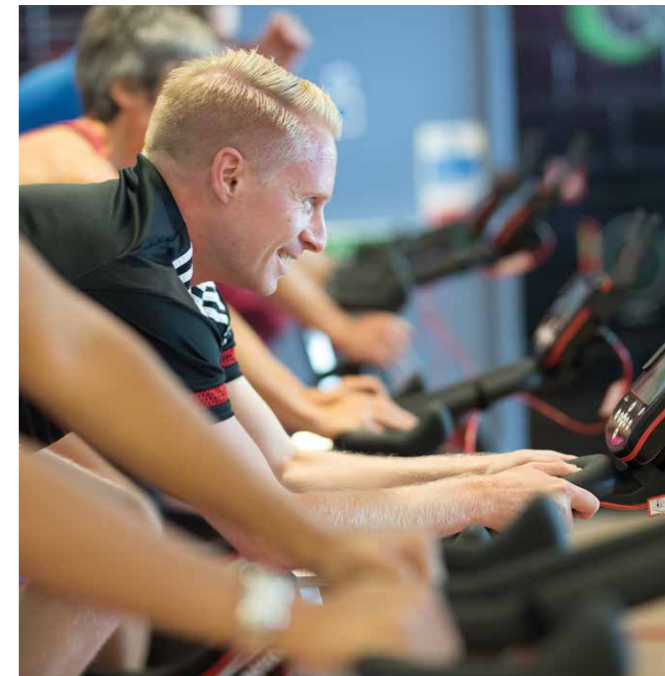

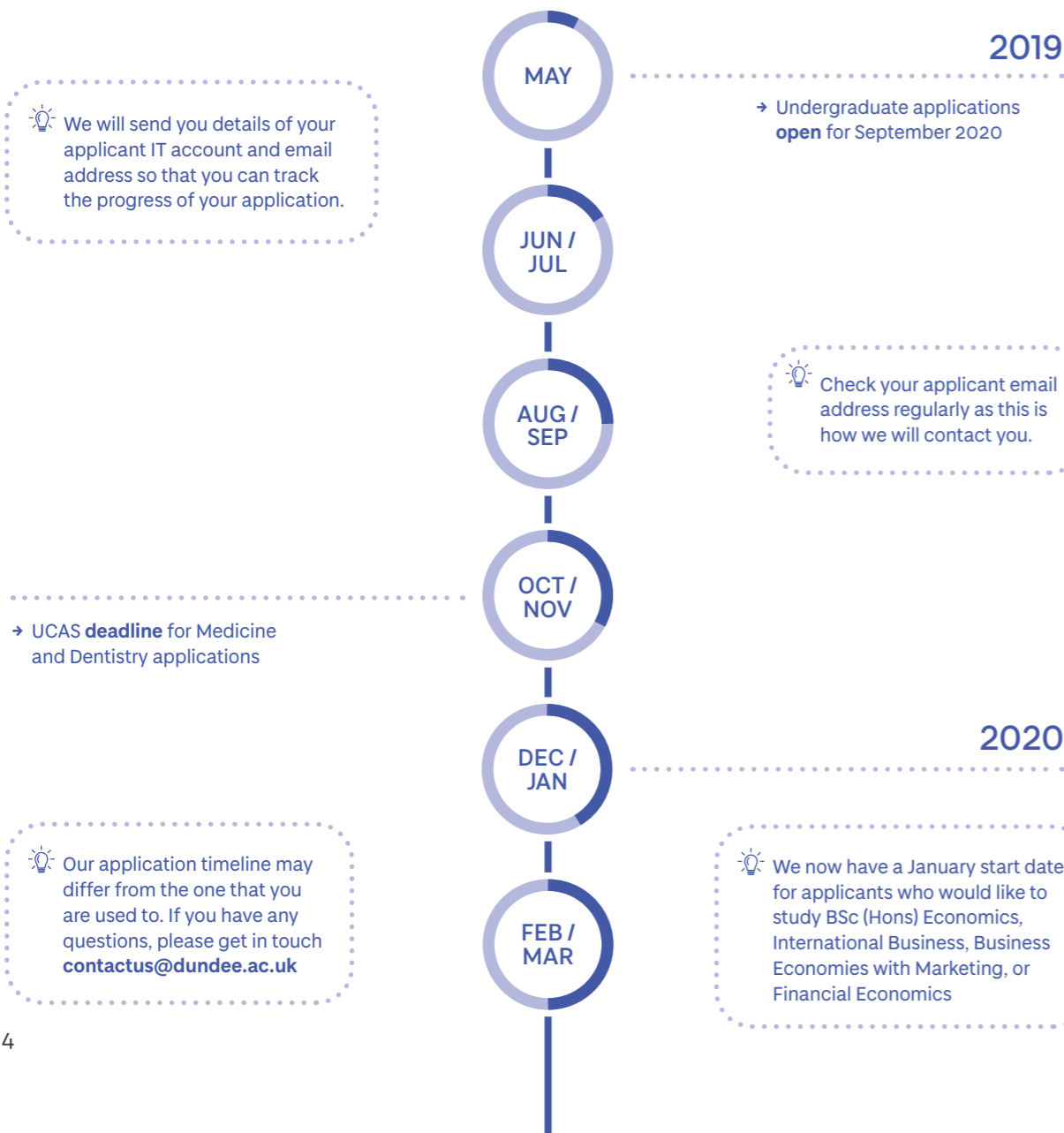

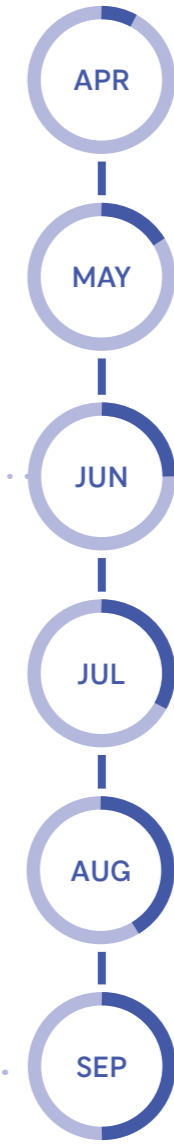


Undergraduate path to Dundee

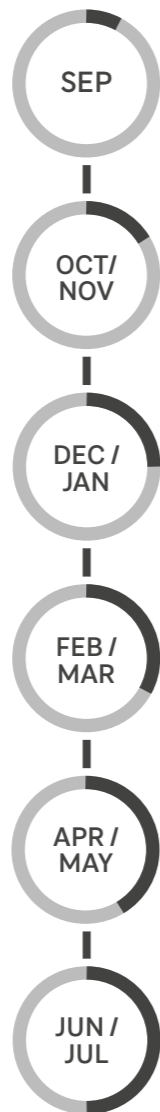
