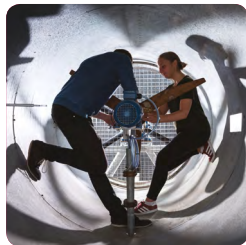

The University of Exeter has three campuses across the South West. Our unique location offers beautiful beaches and countryside on the doorstep.

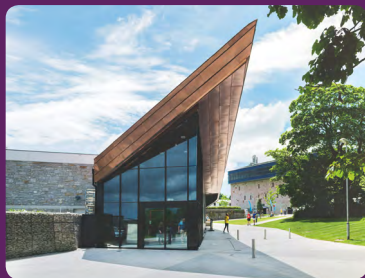

With 40 subjects and hundreds of degree programmes to choose from, you can study your degree in your own way.

We want you to love your degree, which is why we offer flexible programmes and initiatives alongside many of our degrees to ensure you get the most out of your studies:

- **Admissions** – we will take your circumstances into account when making you an offer, which may be below the advertised grade range (a contextual offer)
- **Modules** – many programmes allow you to choose optional modules, including from outside of your department, in a subject area that really grabs your interest
- **A choice of campuses** – different programmes are run across our three campuses - each of which has its own character
- **Flexible Combined Honours** – combine subjects from across the University to tailor your degree so it is unique to you
- **Degree Apprenticeships** – combine university study with paid work in a professional role related to your degree
- **Languages** – learn a new language or improve existing language skills alongside your degree
- **Work experience** – in the UK or abroad
- **Study abroad** – at one of our partner institutions across 36 countries

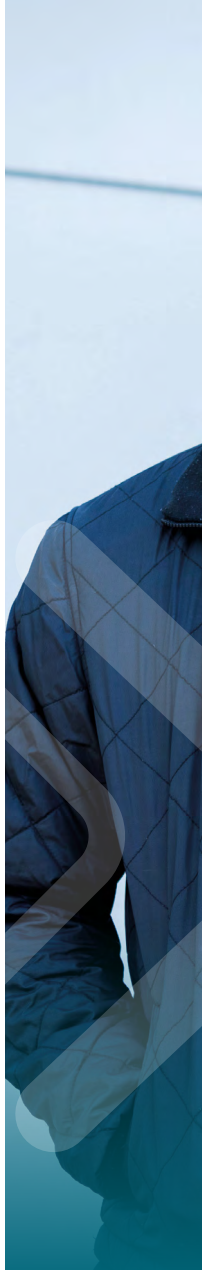
YOUR CAREER STARTS HERE >>

Freshers' week
