Duolingo: 105, minimum 95 in all other components

GCSE: C / 4 or above

**English Language pre-sessional courses:** English Language pre-sessional courses are available for applicants who wish to improve their academic English ahead of starting their studies at York. We aim to open applications for English Language pre-sessionals in November 2022 and you will receive an email once applications are open. **Fees and funding:** This offer is made on the understanding that you have adequate funds to meet the cost of your tuition fees and living expenses for the duration of your programme. For the 2023/4 academic year the tuition fee is £27200.

If you are an international student and your course is longer than one year, you should be aware that the tuition fee in following years will be subject to annual increases. You should take this into account in your financial planning. The fees quoted in your offer letter are normally for one year of study. Fees are subject to increase in subsequent years in line with the prevailing CPI inflation rate (up to a maximum of 10%). The University reserves the right to alter the level of fees. **Student Visa advice:** As an international student, you may need a Student Visa (formerly the Tier 4 Visa) to take up your place at York. Please consult the [Immigration advice](#) web pages for advice on which student visa you require.

If your offer included an English language condition, please also note that only English language tests taken in the last two and a half years relevant to your intended start date are valid for entrance purposes.

In accordance with UK immigration law, if you are applying for a new visa inside the UK, you must apply for the new visa before the course start date, or you will be required to leave the UK and defer your studies.

If you are applying for a visa within a different immigration category, e.g. Standard Visitor visa or dependant, you will be required to provide your visa when you enrol at the University. Further information is available on our [Immigration advice](#) web pages.

### **Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS):**

**Deposits:** You may need to pay a £2,000 deposit as part of the CAS issuance process. For further information please see the [Tuition Fee Deposits Policy](#). If you require a student visa to study in the UK, you will need a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) in order to apply for your student visa. You can request your CAS after you have received, and firmly accepted your offer (unconditional or conditional). We cannot issue your CAS until your offer becomes unconditional and you have made your deposit payment if applicable.

We strongly encourage you to request your CAS as early as possible (from late April onwards). If you are applying for your CAS close to the request deadline this does reduce the amount of time you have by which to book such things as your visa appointment. It is important that you understand the risks involved as the University is not able to control or influence the process through which individual visas are issued by the UKVI and cannot guarantee that a visa will be issued by the last date of arrival for your chosen course.

These delays, which are beyond our control, may mean that you incur additional costs or you are unable to arrive in the UK by the last date of arrival for your chosen course. We strongly advise that you do not book a flight until you have confirmation that your visa has been granted. **Immigration Health Surcharge:** Visas for more than six months include an Immigration Health Surcharge. Paying this will mean that you are entitled to receive certain free health services from the National Health Service (NHS) while you are in the UK, but please note that this is not private medical insurance. 
